

Minutes
May 7, 2007
Regular Council Meeting

Mayor Rick Ford called the meeting to order.

The following Council Members were present constituting a quorum: Larry Estvanko, Jerry Robinson, William Simmons and Gene Yearty.

The first item on the agenda was the Consent Agenda and a motion to accept was made by Jerry Robinson second by William Simmons unanimous by Council.

The Minutes from the April 2, 2007 meeting were read and a motion to accept was made by Jerry Robinson second by William Simmons unanimous by Council.

The Minutes from the April 30, 2007 meeting were read and a motion to accept was made by William Simmons second by Jerry Robinson unanimous by Council.

Planning and Zoning was the first item on the agenda. After the minutes from the planning commission meeting were read Dana McCauley with Crawford and Associates explained to the Council why they were asking for the variances. They were originally requesting four variances but had changed it to two since the last meeting, 1- Variance for 26' from ROW which is 25% reduction and 2- Safety access road to be 25' with turn around. After some discussion the variance was denied due to lack of motion.

Under Old Business was the Senior Citizen Property Tax Relief Exemption. Gene Yearty explained that since the last meeting it was brought to his attention that the city will have to have a referendum in order to precede with the exemption. Gene Yearty requested C.A. Thomas to pursue with the Senior Citizen Property Tax Exemption Referendum.

New Business was not discussed due to Chief Repetto not being present due to illness.

Gene Yearty made a motion to adjourn in order to go into Executive Session second by William Simmons unanimous by Council. William Simmons made a motion to return to regular session second by Gene Yearty unanimous by Council. Gene Yearty made a motion to adjourn second by Jerry Robinson unanimous by Council.
