1. Authorize City Recreation Director Ingrid McKinley to issue a new Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Temple City Park Security System, with a proposal due date of December 1.		

- 2. Amend the original installation sequence for the City of Temple's major sewer line construction project with F. S. Scarbrough, LLC of Fayetteville for this Sewerage System Improvements - Williams Mill Creek Interceptor Upgrade in order for work on Division Three of this project – which includes that section of the sewer line located on the campus of the Temple High School – to begin approximately one month following the conclusion of the school's 2023 football season.

3. Adopt an Ordinance to amend Section 2.06.05 of the City of Temple's Development Code to increase the minimum roadway width of local streets from the current 24' to a new minimum roadway width of 28'
4. Adopt an ordinance to amend Section 16-100 to include required language regarding waste control at construction sites, an EPD requirement for MS4 inspectionsTom Wallace
5. Authorize the purchase by the City Public Works Department of a Skid Steer from Mason Tractor in the amount of \$27,306.43 to be funded from 2021 SPLOSTTom Wallace
6. Authorize the purchase of an ATV by the City Sewer Treatment Plant DepartmentTom Wallace
7. Authorize the purchase of a truck by the City Sewer Treatment Plant DepartmentTom Wallace
8.
